## Workshop on scientific management of waste held

### Goals for striking a balance between rights & responsibilities towards society & state

PORT BLAIR, MAY 8/-/ These islands have a clean and tidy image compared to mainland India. A&N Islands should take a lead in proving that we care about waste management, said the Lt Governor, Lt Gen (Retd) A.K. Singh while speaking at the valedictory function of the workshop on 'Scientific Management of Solid, Liquid, Plastic & Bio-Medical wastes', organized by the Department of Science & Technology, in Megapode Nest here today.

The Lt Governor emphasized that we should strike a balance between our rights and responsibilities towards society as well as the state. "Live today and leave a better tomorrow for generations to follow", said the Lt Governor urging one and all to respect nature by applying environmental and green norms. While complementing the Port Blair Municipal Council for keeping the city clean, the Lt Governor stated that this should not lead to complacency and we should strive to maintain cleanliness throughout the islands. Expressing his concern for the rural areas, the Lt Governor stated that equal attention must be paid to villages and Neil and Havelock Islands should get special attention as they are prime tourist destinations of our Islands. The Lt Governor also informed the gathering that as part of providing better amenities to the residents as well as tourists, cycling tracks and footpaths are being laid at Havelock. He also appealed for better cleanliness in Havelock Island. Emphasizing the need for community initiative and participation in the

endeavor of the Administration, the Lt Governor also stressed the need for project to be designed 'end to end and sustainable'. The Lt Governor assured the Adhyaksha, ZP and Chairman, PBMC of support of the Administration by planning viable projects. In her address on the occasion, the Adhyaksha, Zila Parishad South Andaman, Ms. V.K. Mariyam Bibi thanked the Administration for conducting this all important workshop which enabled the civic bodies to interact with the resource persons for framing a better solid waste management programme in rural areas. She said it was the responsibility of every individual to maintain a pollution free environment.

Speaking on the occasion, the Chairperson, Shri K. Ganeshan showered all praise on the sanitary workers of the PBMC, who, he said, were tirelessly work-

ing round the clock to keep the city clean. He asked for regular medical checkups and providing medicines to the safai karmacharies. He also spoke about the efforts for better waste management in the municipal area. The lack of waste management, he said, not only affects our health but also our well being. PBMC and Zila Parishad have to play a pivotal role in waste management. They should procure right equipment and machinery to ensure proper disposal of waste, the Chief Secretary said, adding that modern techniques are to be used for waste management in these Islands. The Chief Secretary hoped that the seminar will come out with practical, optimal and vi-

able solutions. The Administration will support such proposals, he added. In his address on the occasion, the Secretary (SC & tech)/ Chairman ANPCC, Shri G Theva Neethi Dhas said solid waste in the islands is alarming because of their improper management. The workshop aims at sensitizing the stakeholders and to make an action plan for the benefit of these Islands, he added. The Director S&T, Shri P. Vishwakannan proposed the vote of thanks. Two technical sessions were organized in the morning session of the workshop during which all stakeholders like the PRIs, Pradhans, Councillors, Sanitary staff, intellectuals and Andaman & Nicobar Environment Team (ANET) participated in a vibrant discussion. The Chairperson PBMC, Shri K. Ganeshan was the chairman of the first session while the Adhyaksha ZPSA, Ms Mariyam Bibi chaired the second session.

No. 187/2010/F.No. 2-1/PCC/Plastics/2004.— WHEREAS, it has been noticed that extensive use is being made of plastic carry bags, which by reason of their chemical or physico-chemical properties, are liable to cause harm to human beings, other living creatures, plants, micro-organisms and the environment of Andaman and Nicobar Islands. The negative environmental impacts are more visible at tourist spots, beaches, roads, drains and sewers, markets, ports/ harbours, part of reserved forests, national parks, both marine and terrestrial, wildlife sanctuaries, biological parks, gardens and water reservoirs in the Andaman and Nicobar Islands frequented by the tourists and others.

Whereas, with the view to protect and improve the quality of environment and to prevent, control and abate environmental pollution in the Union Territory of Andaman and Nicobar Islands and in exercise of the powers conferred under Section 5 of the Environment (Protection) Act, 1986 (29 of 1986), read with Notification No. S.O 667(E) dated 10<sup>th</sup> September, 1992 and in supersession of Andaman Nicobar Gazette Notification No. 140 dated 06-10-2009, the Administrator (Lieutenant Governor), Andaman and Nicobar Islands issued notification published in the Gazette vide No. 98 dated 30-04-2010 inviting suggestions and objections for imposing complete ban on use, storage, import, manufacture, transportation, distribution or sale and disposal of plastic carry bags irrespective of thickness, size, color and nature in the Union Territory of Andaman and Nicobar Islands.

Whereas, all objections/suggestions received in response to the draft notification dated 30-04-2010 have been duly considered.

Now, therefore, with the view to protect and improve the quality of environment and to prevent, control and abate environmental pollution in the Union Territory of Andaman and Nicobar Islands, the Administrator (Lieutenant Governor), Andaman and Nicobar Islands in exercise of the powers conferred under Section 5 of the Environment (Protection) Act, 1986 (29 of 1986), read with Notification No. S.O. 667(E) dated 10<sup>th</sup> September, 1992 and in supersession of Notification No. 140 dated 06-10-2009, hereby imposes complete ban on use, storage, import, manufacture, transportation, distribution or sale and disposal of plastic carry bags irrespective of thickness, size, color and nature in the Union Territory of Andaman and Nicobar Islands.

The Administrator, Union Territory of Andaman and Nicobar Islands further directs that the following Officers shall implement these orders related to use, storage, import, manufacture, transportation, distribution or sale and disposal of plastic carry bags irrespective of their thickness, size, color and nature and authorizes them to file complaints under Section 19 of the Environment (Protection) Act, 1986, namely:-

1. The District Magistrates/Assistant Commissioners/ Tehsildars of all Districts.
2. The Secretary, Port Blair Municipal Council.
3. The Chief Executive Officer of all the Zilla Parishads, Executive Officers of Panchayat Samitis, Secretaries of Gram Panchayats.
4. The Divisional Forest Officers/Deputy Conservator of Forests/ Range Officers in Reserved Forests/ Protected Areas.
5. The Station House Officers of all Police Stations.

The Deputy Commissioners of all the districts of U.T. of Andaman and Nicobar Islands shall implement the above orders related to prohibition on use, storage, import, manufacture, transportation, distribution or sale and disposal of plastic carry bags in their respective jurisdictions.

The Administrator, Union Territory of Andaman and Nicobar Islands hereby, further directs that the Member Secretary, Andaman Nicobar Administration Pollution Control Committee shall co-ordinate and monitor the enforcement of the above orders and also authorizes him to file complaints under Section 19 of the Environment (Protection) Act, 1986.

Any violation of these directions shall entail punishment under the Environment (Protection) Act, 1986.

It is further ordered that the above directions shall come into force on expiry of 60 days from the date of publication in the Gazette and shall be applicable in the entire Union Territory of Andaman and Nicobar Islands.

No. 285/2010/F. No. 2-1/PCC/Plastics/2004.— The Andaman and Nicobar Administration is pleased to announce a New Scheme for transportation of Plastic Waste to mainland. Under this scheme freight charges shall be exempted for transportation of **all sorts of** Plastic Wastes from various Islands to Port Blair/Mainland Port and from Port Blair to Mainland Port (Chennai, Vishakapatnam & Kolkata).

**1. Name & Title of the Scheme :**

This scheme may be called the "Andaman and Nicobar Islands Scheme for Exemption of Freight Charges for Transportation of Plastic Wastes".

**2. Commencement & Duration :**

The scheme shall come in force with effect from 1<sup>st</sup> October, 2010 and remain in operation upto 30<sup>th</sup> September, 2013 initially.

**3. Definitions :**

- I. "Freight Charges" means the expenditure incurred for transportation of Plastic Wastes by Ships run by Andaman and Nicobar Administration from origination port to destination port but shall not include the wharfage charges, barge charges, handling charges, loading and unloading charges etc. which are connected with transportation by ship/surface transport.
- II. "Plastic Waste" means all kinds of Plastic Wastes which meant for recycling/ safe disposal in mainland.
- III. "Registration" means the registration obtained by an Enterprise/individual from District Industries Centre for transportation of Plastic Wastes from various Islands to Port Blair and shredded/compacted/pelletised plastic waste from Port Blair to Mainland Port (Chennai, Vishakapatnam & Kolkata).
- IV. "DSS Ships" means Ships run by Directorate of Shipping Services, Andaman and Nicobar Administration.

**4. Applicability/Eligibility :**

The Enterprises/individuals involved in the transportation of all kinds of Plastic Wastes which are meant for recycling/safe disposal in mainland shall be eligible for freight exemption under this Scheme provided they have obtained registration from District Industries Centre and authorization from Principal Secretary (S&T), A & N Administration.

**5. Terms & Conditions :**

- i. Exemption for freight charges for transportation of Plastic Wastes by DSS Ships shall be available subject to availability of empty containers/cargo space in the ships.
- ii. The exemption of freight charges shall be restricted between various Islands to Port Blair/Mainland Port and from Port Blair to Mainland Port (Chennai, Vishakapatnam & Kolkata), Plastic Wastes shall be transported in shredded/pelletised or compacted forms from Port Blair to Mainland.
- iii. Other than exemption of freight charges in a DSS ships, no other charges including surface transport charges for collection and transportation of Plastic Wastes upto the ship/recycling units shall be payable under this scheme.
- iv. The enterprise/individual interested in Plastic Wastes transportation under this scheme shall maintain register/documents detailing quantity of Plastic Wastes sent to mainland and shall permit officials of District Industries Centre/Pollution Control Committee for inspection of the unit/records. The enterprise/individual shall also submit quarterly report to Principal Secretary (S&T).
- v. The port dues and other incidental charges such as clearing and forwarding in Island Ports and Mainland Ports shall be borne by the enterprise/individual. Documentation, obtaining clearance from various authorities in dispatch port and arrival port shall be responsibility of the enterprise/individual.
- vi. In case of demurrage towards non-clearance of cargo from the port/vessel, expenditure shall be borne by the enterprise/individual.
- vii. In case of cargo is over carried back due to non-clearance by the enterprise/individual in schedule time, the freight charges towards over carriage shall be paid by the enterprise/individual.
- viii. The Plastic Waste may be carried as break bulk cargo. In case of transportation in containers, the charges for stuffing /de-stuffing and container handling shall be borne by the enterprise/individual.
- ix. The DSS shall not be responsible in case of loss, damage etc. suffered by the enterprise/individual towards transportation of Plastic Wastes.

**6. Procedure for Sending Plastic Wastes :**

- i. Enterprise/individual intending to avail freight exemption under this scheme shall apply for registration in prescribed form (Annexure-I) to District Industries Centre, Port Blair.
- ii. After obtaining registration, the enterprise/individual shall apply to the Principal Secretary (S&T) for issue of authorization letter for transportation of Plastic Wastes by DSS Ships.
- iii. After obtaining authorization, the enterprise/individual shall apply to the Director, Shipping Services for transporting the Plastic Wastes.
- iv. The Director, Shipping Services shall permit only those enterprise/individual who are authorized by the Principal Secretary (S&T) to transport the Plastic Wastes.
- v. The Director, Shipping Services shall ensure that the enterprise/individual transports only Plastic Wastes. DSS shall obtain and undertaking to that effect from the concerned enterprise/individual.

**7. Withdraw of exemption of Freight/Charges :**

The Principal Secretary (S&T) may withdraw the exemption from payment of freight charges under the scheme in respect of an enterprise/individual under any of the following circumstances:

- a. In case, there is a breach of any condition stipulated in para 5 or 6 of the scheme by the unit/individual.
- b. In case, the beneficiary is found ineligible due to any other reason, whatsoever, the Principal Secretary (S&T) shall be at liberty to withdraw exemption from payment of freight charges in full or part thereof, for reasons to be recorded in writing.

**8. Power of Interpretation :**

Power of Interpretation of any clause under the scheme shall vest with the A & N Administration.

Sir,

This has reference to the meeting held in Van Sadan , Haddo on 15/04/2015 at 4.00 PM regarding above subject matter. In this regards it is to inform that the NRSE Division of Electricity Department had installed 84 Nos pre-fabricated 2m3 size Biogas plants in rural area of this Islands since 1992 in order to utilize the available cow dung and other waste materials. On recent study it is found that majority of these plants are not running successfully because of insufficient availability of cow dungs and other waste materials to feed the plants. Moreover, the animals are not stall fed as such dung is not available at one place.

At present power generation by utilizing municipal waste is not done in this Island.

Recently, The Energy Resources of Institute (TERI), New Delhi had prepared a pre-feasibility study report of six islands of A&N islands for generating power through biomass residue available in islands. They recommended that biomass power plants could be installed at Car Nicobar - 2.25 MW, South Andaman - 540 KW, North Andaman - 310 KW, Mayabunder - 130 KW, Middle Andaman - 440 KW by utilizing the available coconut/areca nut wastes, tree branches and other minor forest waste materials. Now the department is in the process of establishment of biomass power plant at South Andaman and at Car Nicobar. This is for your information please.

I am directed to refer your letter No. 6-38/SCTECH/Swachha Bharat/2014/409 dated 12.12.2014 on the subject cited above. In this regard the monthly progress report of A & N Police for the month of March, 2015 is as follows.

The A & N Police is regularly conducting a weekly Refresher training to Police personnel of PSs/OPs and JPPs at PS Aberdeen.

In their training curriculum North Bay Beach has been adopted for beach cleaning of these refresher trainees which is firmly monitored every week.


The Executive Police, IRBn Personnel and Home Guards deployed at various islands have cleaned the area of their respective Jurisdiction, specifically Nilambur Jetty, Uttara Village, Parna Shala, Pinaki Nagar, Mayabunder Bazaar, Naba Gram and Diglipur Bazaar, Haddo, Police quarter area PS Pahargaon, wandour Beach, Collin Pur Beach, Police residential colony of Bamboo Flat, Sea Shore area near Havelock Jetty, Bharat Pur and Jetty area of Neil Island, Chattan Beach Hut Bay, Perka Village Car Nicobar, Govt. Secondary School Bengali Village Teressa, Power House Junction area Katchal, Indra Park Nancowry and Medical Colony.

During the month, 71 persons were prosecuted under 34(5) & 34(7) of the Indian Police Act 1861 for dumping of garbage in public areas/residential localities and for willful indecent exposure of person in public place (bathing, washing, urinating). Till date 228 persons were prosecuted and all the violators were fined.

## BMC sounds caution against littering public places

Port Blair, Feb 24: The Port Blair Municipal Council (PBMC) has cautioned the people and business community against littering the public places. In a press release received here, the PBMC has stated that the general public, traders, businessmen, hotelier, tourist etc have been found to be littering on the public properties such as footpath/roads/parks/garden/seashore and sea beaches by erratically throwing garbage indiscriminately at various places, which results in an untidy and unhygienic perspective of the city. The PBMC has decided to take immediate action on the matter as such acts are not only causing inconvenience to the public but also spreading diseases. Accordingly, in exercise of powers conferred under Sub-section 49 of the Andaman & Nicobar Islands (Municipal) Regulation, 1961, the Chairperson, PBMC hereby prohibits everyone from littering in the municipal area.

If anyone litters in the municipal area, he/she will be dealt with strictly and shall have to pay fine to the extent of Rs.100/- for individual littering landward side and Rs.500/- for seashore and seaside and Rs.5000/- for littering by commercial establishment at public places, a communication from the Secretary, Municipal Council said.



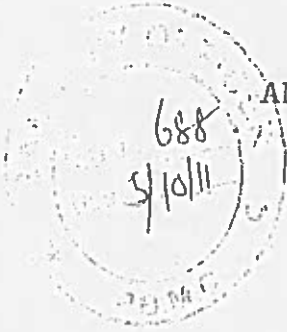
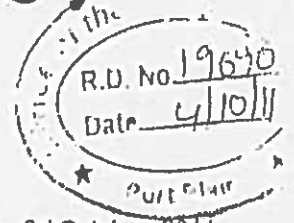

## PRESS NOTE

In spite of repeated warnings to the cattle owners by the Municipal Council, it is found that the cattle, pigs and goats owners are allowing their cattle, pigs and goats to move about freely on the roads, public places and public building premises. This not only poses threats for the vehicles moving on the roads but also for the pedestrians and also creates insanitation conditions on roads and public places. **PORT BLAIR MUNICIPAL COUNCIL (PBMC)**  
**Solid Waste Management By-law (SWM BL)**

1. This By-law enacted shall be known and may be cited as the "Port Blair Municipal Council Solid Waste Management By-law" of the Municipality of the Port Blair.

**Definitions**

2. In this By-law:
  - (1) "Administrator" means the person appointed by the Chief Administrative Officer of the Municipality to administer this By-law, or their designate;
  - (2) "adverse effect" means an effect that impairs or damages the environment, the health of humans or the reasonable enjoyment of life or property;
  - (3) "asbestos" means a friable waste material containing asbestos fiber or asbestos dust in a concentration greater than 1'7c by weight;
  - (4) "backyard composting" means the composting at a residential property of organic solid waste, comprised of leaf and yard waste and food, but excluding meat, fish, eggs or dairy products, where:
    - a. the waste is generated by the residents of the property or neighboring properties or both; and
    - b. The annual production of compost on any property lot does not exceed 10 cubic meters.
  - (5) "beverage" means any liquid that is a ready to serve drink, but does not include milk, milk products, soya milk or concentrates;
  - (6) "beverage container" means a container of 5 liters or less which contains or has contained a beverage and was sealed by the manufacturer after the beverage was placed in it;
  - (7) "box board" means cereal boxes, shoe boxes, tissue boxes, detergent boxes, cracker boxes, cookie boxes, baking product boxes and frozen food boxes or other similar items, toilet paper rolls and paper towel rolls or other similar items, with plastics removed;

- (8) "bulky items" means large items of a household nature including but not limited to furniture, stoves, refrigerators, dishwashers, mattresses, bed springs, empty hot water and oil tanks, toys, bicycles and lawn furniture. "Bulky items" also includes a small amount of debris from renovation, construction or demolition that does not exceed twenty-five (25) kilograms per unit and one (1) cubic meter in size;
- (9) "chlorofluorocarbons" means an ozone depleting substance that is required under the Ozone Layer Depletion Regulations to be removed in a controlled fashion to prevent its release into the environment, and is a substance found in refrigeration and cooling units;
- (10) "collector" means an individual or company that has been granted a collector's license by the Municipality for the collection and disposal of residual garbage, recyclables or compostable or combination thereof to designated municipal solid waste management facilities;
- (11) "Collector's license" means a permit that is required by a collector to collect and dispose of solid waste to municipal solid waste management facility;
- (12) "compostables" means food scraps and spoiled or waste food or foodstuff including vegetable peelings, meat, fish, eggs, bones, waste food products, pet litter, soiled and wet and soiled paper products such as table napkins, paper towels, pizza boxes, leaves and grass clippings, branches and bushes that are four feet or less in length and two centimeters or less in diameter together with such other compostable materials as may be identified in public education documents distributed by the Municipality from time to time; and
- (13) "composting" means the nuisance-free biological decomposition of organic materials, substances or objects under controlled circumstances to a condition sufficiently stable for nuisance-free storage and for safe use in land applications as identified by the Andaman & Nicobar Islands Environment's Solid Waste Management Resource Regulations;
- (14) "construction and demolition debris" means materials which are normally used in the construction of buildings, structures, roadways, walls and other landscaping material and includes, but is not limited to, soil, asphalt, brick, mortar, drywall, plaster, cellulose, fiberglass fibers, gyproc, lumber, wood, asphalt shingles, and metals and such other materials as may be permitted by applicable laws;

- (15) "contaminant" means a substance that causes or may cause an adverse effect;
- (16) "contaminated soil" means any soil which has been polluted with an organic or inorganic contaminant in excess of standards prescribed or adopted by the Minister, and that has caused, is causing, or may cause an adverse effect;
- (17) "Council" means the Council for the Municipality of the Port Blair.
- (18) "curb" means the three meter distance from the travelled portion of a public street or road where it joins the sidewalk or shoulder to the public property, but it does not include the ditch;
- (19) "hazardous waste" means waste that may be harmful to humans, animals, plant life or natural resources, including but not restricted to, industrial chemicals, explosive, toxic, flammable, corrosive, radioactive, reactive, pathological and PCB waste, oil, gasoline, paint solvent, wood preservatives, ink, battery acid, pesticides and insecticides or any substance or material declared or defined to be a hazardous or toxic substance in or pursuant to any applicable law;
- (20) "household hazardous waste" means waste of a potentially hazardous nature typically generated in residential households including but not restricted to, solvents, glues, cleaners, paints and finishes, asphalt sealers, gasoline, diesel, kerosene, pesticides, lawn and garden chemicals, poisons, propane tanks, roofing tar, pool chemicals, lubricating oil, batteries, and automotive fluids, but does not include PCB waste, radioactive materials, explosives, fireworks, pathological wastes, or ammunition;
- (21) "hospital and pharmaceutical waste" means waste generated at hospitals, clinics, pharmacies, veterinary clinics, dentist offices and includes, but not limited to used needles, drugs, dressings, excluding pathological waste;
- (22) "industrial waste" means residual waste typically generated in the industrial, commercial and institutional sector;
- (23) "land" means surface land, land covered by water, subsoil, matter beneath the subsoil or any combination or part thereof;
- (24) "leaf and yard waste" means vegetative matter resulting from gardening, horticulture, landscaping or land clearing operations, including materials such as tree and shrub trimmings, plant remains, grass clippings, leaves, trees and stumps, but excludes construction and demolition debris or contaminated soil or any other organic material that has been contaminated;

- (25) "litter means any material left or abandoned in a place other than a container or place intended or approved for receiving such material;
- (26) "Minister" means the Minister of Environment for the Andaman & Nicobar Island.
- (27) "Municipality" means the Municipality of the Port Blair
- (28) "municipality" solid waste management facility" means a site identified by the municipality for disposal of designated solid waste ;
- (29) "organics cart" means a wheeled aerated cart designed to be emptied by hydraulic lifting device and approved by the Municipality for the storage and municipal collection of compostables;
- (30) " pathological waste" any part of the human body excepting hair, nail clippings and the like, any part of a communicable disease, and non-anatomical waste infected with a communicable disease;
- (31) "public education documents" includes newspaper, radio and local television advertisements, information posted to the Municipality's website and newsletter pamphlets, flyers or the other material circulated electronically or by ordinary mail or delivery by or for the Municipality or the Minister;
- (32) "recyclable container materials" means redeemable beverage containers, steel, tin or aluminum food containers or cans, glass food containers, jars and bottles, low density polyethylene bags and packaging, high density bags, containers and packaging, poly coat containers for milk, milk products, soya milk, concentrates or other liquids or powders, tetra packs together with such other plastic recyclable materials as may be identified in public education documents distributed by the municipality from time to time;
- (33) "recyclable paper materials" means corrugated cardboard, egg cartons , board, newsprint, bond paper, computer paper, glossy flyers and magazines together with such other paper recyclable materials as may be identified in public education document distributed by the Municipality from time to time;
- (34) "recyclables" means recyclable paper materials or recyclable container material as defined in this By-law;

- (35) "redeemable" beverage container" means a beverage container for which a consumer was required to pay a deposit;
- (36) "residual garbage" means waste other than;
- (a) Recyclables;
  - (b) compostables;
  - (c) leaf and yard waste; and
  - (d) any other waste that is prohibited from disposal by way of municipal collection or at a municipal solid waste management facility designated for residue garbage by this By-law or by the Minister;
- (37) "sharps" means syringes, lancets and pen needles;
- (38) "solid waste" means residual garbage, recyclables and compostables, as well as any other type of waste defined in this By-law and specifically referred to in this By-law as permitted or prohibited for disposal at a municipal solid waste management facility;
- (39) "septic waste" means the liquid and solid material removed from septic tanks, sewage treatment plants, and manholes, cesspools, privies and portable toilets;
- (40) "tires" means tires that are not designated under the Andaman & Nicobar Islands tire recycling program.
- (41) "waste" means any substance that would cause or tend to cause an adverse effect if added to the environment, and includes garbage, recyclables, compostables, refuse, sludge, rubbish, tailings, debris, litter and other discarded materials resulting from residential, commercial, institutional and industrial activities which are commonly accepted at a municipal solid waste resource management facilities, but excludes wastes from industrial activities which are regulated by an approval issued by the Minister;
- (42) "waste diversion" means waste reduction, reuse, recycling or composting;
- (43) "wood" means wood materials that are not contaminated with other non-wood
- (44) Materials, such as are dimensional lumber, wooden chairs, fencing etc.

## Disposal of Solid Waste

3. Every person shall dispose of solid waste in accordance with this By-law.

### NO ILLEGAL DUMPING

4. Except for the placement of solid waste for collection in accordance with this By-law, no person shall deposit, Cause to be deposited or permit to be deposited solid waste at any place in the Municipality other than at a Municipal solid waste management facility designated for the applicable type of solid waste, or at any other Site Authorized by the Municipality and approved for the purpose by the Minister.
5. Subject to section 4, the following depositing activities are permissible:
  - (1) backyard composting, provided that :
    - (a) the composting container or pile is not located within 10 meters of any window or door of a structure on an adjacent property; and
    - (b) The activity carried out in such manner as not to constitute a nuisance.
  - (2) The concentrated disposal of trees, brush or portions thereof or other farm or forestry waste by decay On forest or farm land, provided this activity is carried out in compliance withal applicable laws of the Port Blair municipal council and
  - (3) The nuisance free disposal of aggregate, soil, brick, mortar, concrete, asphalt pavement, porcelain or Ceramic materials as clean fill, provided this activity is carried out in compliance with all applicable Laws of the Andaman and Nicobar Islands



## **NO SALVAGING**

6. No person shall
  1. Pick up, remove, disturb or otherwise interfere with solid waste at a municipal solid waste management Facility, or
  2. Pick up, remove, disturb or otherwise interfere with solid waste placed at the curb for collection by the Municipality or by the contractor, Except as authorized by the municipality

## **NO SOLID WASTE BURNING**

7. No person shall burn solid waste in a barrel, stove or other device or in the open as a method of waste Disposal, except for brush, tree limbs and milled wood that is free from adhesives, coatings and Preservatives, but only where such burning of brush, tree limbs and milled wood is otherwise permitted By-law.

## **LITTER ABATEMENT**

8. No person shall release or cause litter to be released into the environment, except in accordance with this Bye-law.

## **DISPOSAL AT MUNICIPAL SOLID WASTE MANAGEMENT FACILITIES**

9. No person shall place, cause to be placed or permit to be placed at, in or on a municipal solid waste Management facility any material or quantity of material in contravention of:
  - (1) This bye-law or any policy of the municipality concerning the use of the municipal solid waste Management facility, including but not restricted to waste diversion policies requiring the diversion Of particular types facility or quantities of solid waste from particular types of municipal solid waste Management facilities;
  - (2) The direction of the operator or the staff of a municipal solid waste management facility with respect to the type, method, volume, weighing, measuring, time, location or any other condition for placement of solid waste; and
  - (3) Any National or state/ Union territory law, including any law requiring the diversion of particular types of Quantities from solid waste from particular types of solid waste management facilities.

10. No person shall place, cause to be placed or permit to be placed any solid waste at or adjacent to a municipal Solid waste management facility when the facility is not open or when the operator or staff of the municipal Solid waste management facility refuses to accept any loads or items of solid waste.
11. The operator or staff of a solid waste management facility may refuse solid waste under the following Circumstances;
  - (1) Where the municipal solid waste management facility is not designated for the type of solid waste a Person is attempting to place;
  - (2) Where requisite tipping fee has not been paid;
  - (3) Where the source of the solid waste is not identified;
  - (4) Where the source of solid waste is outside the boundaries of the Municipality;
  - (5) Where the facility is unable to weigh, measure or process the solid waste for any reason, including but not restricted to excessive inventory of solid waste or shortage of space, mechanical or electrical break down or labour dispute or
  - (6) Where the operation of the solid waste management facility would be compromised by the placement of the solid waste; or
  - (7) Where the solid waste would be placed in contravention of this By-law or a law of the Andaman & Nicobar Islands and of the Government of India.
12. No person shall place, cause to be placed or permit to be placed in a municipal solid waste management facility any solid waste;
  - 1) That is not separated as required by this By-law.
  - 2) That is falsely or misleadingly presented or packaged as solid waste of a particular origin, or
  - 3) That is concealed within or inter-mingled with solid waste of another kind, type, stream or place of origin..
13. For greater certainty, solid waste that is
  - 1) Not permitted to be placed for collection or to be delivered to a municipal solid waste management facility pursuant to this By-law, or

- 2) Generated outside the municipality May not be disposed of at a municipal solid waste management facility except where the Municipality or the operator of a municipal solid waste management facility has given a person written approval to do so in advance.

## **Storage, Separation and Removal of Solid Waste**

### **No Accumulation of Solid waste**

14.

- 1) No owner or occupant of a property in the Municipality shall permit the accumulation of solid waste in or around the property to the extent that it is or is likely to become a nuisance or cause an adverse effect.
  - 2) Where an owner or occupant permits the accumulation of solid waste contrary to subsection (1), the Administration may enter the property to collect and dispose of the accumulated solid waste, the expense of which will be charged to the owner or occupant who has contravened subsection (1).
  - 3) For greater clarity, the Administration may enter the property to collect and dispose of any uncollected solid waste scattered by animals, pests or weather that an owner or occupant fails to remove pursuant to section 28 (4) of this By- Law, the expense of which will be charged to the owner or occupant.
15. Owner and occupants of every property in the Municipality that is subject to municipal collection shall ensure all solid waste is properly stored and placed for collection and disposal.

16.

- 1) Council may provide for general municipal collection of solid waste by its own employees or by a contractor in some or all areas of the Municipality.
- 2) Without limiting the generality of subsection 1), Council may, at its discretion, use different classification of collection services and different classification of waste generators.

3) Without limiting the generality of subsection 1) and 2), Council may, at its discretion, limit collection to:

- a. Particular types of Solid waste:
- b. Properties containing not more than a specified number of residential households;
- c. Properties which are seasonal; and
- d. Properties generating industrial waste of a particular type or size or generated not more than a specified volume of solid waste.

17.

- (1) Owners and occupants of every property in the Municipality that is not made subject to municipal collection are responsible for providing for the lawful collection and disposal of all solid waste in accordance with this Bye-Law, and for paying any associated collection, disposal or tipping fees.
- (2) For greater certainty, owners and occupiers of every property in the Municipality that is not made subject to municipal collection are responsible for separating solid waste in accordance with this Bye-Law.

18.

- (1) The Municipality may contract with owners and occupiers whose properties are ineligible for municipal collection pursuant to this Bye-Law, to provide collection of their solid waste.
- (2) The limitations and restrictions in this Bye-Law applicable to general municipal collection shall apply to the owners and occupiers in subsection (1), except to the extent that those limitations or restrictions are expressly varied in any contract reached between the Municipality and the owner or occupiers pursuant to subsection (1).

### **Special Collections**

19.

- (1) Council may, at its discretion,
  - a. Provide for special municipal solid waste collections on an occasional basis, or
  - b. Provide for municipal collection from a drop-off site.  
of particular types of solid waste, such as discarded Idols, of

Gods/Statutes, bulky items not eligible for regular municipal collection, leaf and yard waste, household hazardous waste or other specified solid waste.

(2) When providing for special collections pursuant to subsection (1), Council may limit such special collection to

- a) Particular areas of the Municipality,
- b) Properties containing not more than a specified number of residential households, or
- c) Properties generating industrial waste of a particular type or size or generating not more than a specified volume of solid waste.

#### **Separation and Storage**

20.

(1) Owners and occupants of every property in the Municipality shall separate solid waste at the time and place of generation into the following streams:

- a) Compostables;
- b) Recyclable container materials;
- c) Recyclable paper materials;
- d) Residual garbage;
- e) Construction and demolition debris;
- f) Contaminated soil;
- g) Asbestos;
- h) Solid waste of any type which is not acceptable for municipal collection or accepted at a municipal solid waste management facility, each such type separated in its own stream; and
- i) Solid waste of any type which is only accepted on the occasion of special collections, or by contract or by express approval in advance of the operator of a municipal solid waste management facility, each such type separated in its own stream;

(2) Owners and occupants of every property in the Municipality shall take positive steps to ensure that all solid waste separated in accordance with subsection (1) remains separated and uncontaminated by any other type

of solid waste.

- (3) For greater certainty, the obligations to separate and maintain separation of solid waste in subsections (1) and (2) extend to owners, management and staff of restaurants and other establishments serving the public, which must also provide containers to facilitate separation and non-contamination of solid waste streams by owners, management, staff and clientele as appropriate for the types of establishment.
  - (4) Subject to subsection (1), residual garbage may include compostables or recyclable materials to the extent that separation of compostables and recyclables was not reasonably possible because of
    - a. The fusing or bonding together of materials in the state in which the waste received, or
    - b. The reasonable cross-contamination of material in the ordinary course of use, if such contamination is unavoidable even by the exercise of due diligence.
21. Owners and occupants of every property in the municipality shall provide sufficient and adequate space and container for the storage, Collection and disposal of any solid waste which may accumulate from time on the property.
  22. Without limiting the generality of section 20, owners and occupants of every property in the Municipality shall provide space and containers in accordance with the following provisions:
    - (1) compostables shall be stored in organics carts or in other containers that are water proof, impervious to domestic and wild animals and rodents and designed to avoid the entrapment of children, and such organics cart or container shall be placed or kept as far as possible from any window or door situated on an abutting or adjacent property, but preferably at a distance of at least ten (10) meters; and
    - (2) recyclables and residual garbage shall be stored inside buildings or in containers that are water-proof, impervious to domestic and wild animals and rodents and designed to avoid the entrapment of children.
  23. Owners and occupants of every property in the municipality which is eligible for municipal collection of solid waste are responsible for keeping all

containers in clean and useable state and to ensure that they are maintained so as to not become a nuisance.

24. Bulk commercial containers used for the collection or storage of solid waste:
- (1) Shall be sturdily constructed, water-proof and impervious to domestic and wild animals and rodents;
  - (2) Shall be designed to avoid the entrapment of children;
  - (3) Shall be equipped with a tight-fitting lid with a positive closing device which shall be kept closed except when the container is loaded or unloaded.
  - (4) Shall be kept clean and in a good state of repair.
  - (5) Shall not be loaded in a manner which permits waste to extend beyond the internal volume of the container when the container when the lid is closed;
  - (6) Shall be labeled for the purpose of identifying what materials the container contains;
  - (7) Shall have sufficient space or sectioning to store solid waste separated in accordance with the provisions of this By-law in such a manner that can ensure that separated solid waste remains separated and uncontaminated by other types of solid waste.
25. Owners or occupants of premises serviced by a bulk commercial container shall;
- 1) Keep the area surrounding the container free from any type of waste; and
  - 2) Provide instruction to any tenants, visitors or employees to ensure proper disposal and separation and disposal.
26. Any solid waste that is a bulky item that has a door, lid or other apparatus that enables the bulky item to be closed, including but not limited to refrigerators and freezers, shall either be stored inside an enclosed, locked or child-proof building or shall have their door, lid or other closing apparatus removed from the bulky item.
27. Where a person wishes to dispose of solid waste containing chlorofluorocarbons, that person must:

- 1) Safely deliver the solid waste to the Port Blair Municipal Council Balefill Facility to have the chlorofluorocarbons removed by a certified technician or
- 2) Arrange to have the chlorofluorocarbons removed by a certified by certified technician and accordingly labeled by the certified technician in accordance with the Ozone Layer Protection Regulations of the Andaman and Nicobar Environment Act, and safely deliver that solid waste to the PBMC Balefill landfill Facility.

### **Rules for Municipal Collection**

28. Except as authorized by the Municipality from time to time, including but not restricted to public education documents published in connection with special collection days, persons placing solid waste for municipal collection shall comply with following:

- 1) Solid waste shall be placed for collection within three (3) meters of the curd directly in front of the property that is the source of the solid waste, and shall be placed in such a manner as to interfere as little as possible with pedestrian traffic and mud removal;
- 2) Solid waste shall not be placed for collection before 6:00 a.m. on the day of collection;
- 3) Solid waste shall not be placed for collection before 9.00 p.m. on the day preceding the collection date for that property and for the collection date for that property;
- 4) Uncollected solid waste and any solid waste scattered by animals, pest or weather shall be removed by the owner or occupant of the property from which that solid waste was placed for collection not later than 9.0 p.m. on the collection date for that property;
- 5) Residual garbage shall be placed for collection in securely tied, clear, transparent, plastic, waste-proof bags of a dimension not greater than 77 centimeters x 84 centimeters and volume not greater than 77 liters and shall not exceed a weight of 25 kilograms per bag;
- 6) Not more than six (6) bags and/or containers containing bags of residual garbage shall be placed for collection on any one collection day;
- 7) Residual garbage placed pursuant to subsection (6) must be placed in transparent bags as required by subsection (5), except that one (1) bag of residual garbage per collection may be placed in a bag that is not transparent, in which residual garbage of a private or personal nature may be placed;
- 8) Recyclables shall be placed for collection in securely tied, blue-tinted or clear, plastic, water-proof bags of a dimension not greater than 7



- centimeters x 84 centimeters and a volume not greater than 77 liters, and shall not exceed a weight of kilograms per bag;
- 9) Residual garbage and recyclables may be placed for collection in waste collection boxes located within three (3) meters of the curb, provided that:
    - (a) All residual garbage and recyclables are properly bagged as required by this By-law;
    - (b) The box is impervious to domestic and wild animals, rodents, insects, and which are designed to avoid the entrapment of children; and
    - (c) The box has a securely hinged lid or lids;
    - (d) The box has a support to hold the lid open while the contents are being emptied;
    - (e) The solid waste is placed within the box in accordance with all other requirements of this section, including separation of solid waste streams and placement in specified bags;
  - 10) Compostables shall be placed for collection in organics carts;
  - 11) Bulky items placed for collection as authorized for municipal collection by the Municipality shall not exceed 25 Kilograms in weight for any one bundle or container and not exceed 1 cubic meter in size, with the exception of furniture or appliance items, and shall not exceed 325 kilograms for all bulky items for any one residential unit;
  - 12) When bulky items are authorized for municipal collection by the Municipality, no more than one of each type of appliance is permitted per collection; and
  - 13) When Idols of gods and statue waste is authorized for municipal collection by the Municipality, it shall not have any decorations, ornaments, stands, plastic bags, wires or nails attached and shall not exceed three (3) meters in length.
29. No person shall place solid waste for collection on a property other than a property owned or occupied by that person or a property which that person has obtained the consent of the owner or occupier for the purpose of placing solid waste for collection.

### **Solid Waste not Permitted for Municipal Collection**

30. Except where authorized by the Municipality, no person shall place for collection:

- 1) Hazardous waste;
- 2) Sharps;
- 3) Pathological waste;
- 4) Hospital and Pharmaceutical waste;
- 5) Asbestos;
- 6) Septic waste;
- 7) Hot ashes;
- 8) Dead animal carcasses larger than 10 kg;
- 9) Industrial waste, including non-residential , farm, forestry or fishing waste;
- 10) Materials that are prohibited from disposal by municipal collection by the laws of the Andaman and Nicobar Islands.
- 11) Solid waste generated outside the Municipality;
- 12) Construction and demolition debris that exceeds the dimensions or weight allowable for bulky item collection by the provisions of this By-law; and
- 13) Other materials or solid waste as may be identified as unacceptable for municipal collection by the documents distributed by the Municipality from time to time.

### **Collector's Licensing Permit**

#### **Collector's License Required**

31. No person shall engage in the business of collecting or transporting solid waste to a solid waste management facility unless the person holds a current collector's License for that purpose granted by the Municipality.

#### **Application for and Renewal of Collector's License**

32. Every application for a collector's license, including a renewal of a collector's license shall:
  - 1) Be made in writing and in duplicate, and on such form as may be specified by the Administration from time to time, and signed by the person applying.
  - 2) Be made by April 30 of a fiscal year, which is from April 1 to March 31, for a collector's license to be granted for that fiscal year;
  - 3) Contain the following:
    - a) The name, mailing address and phone number of the application;
    - b) The current fax number or the current e-mail address of the applicant, or both;

- c) The state motor vehicle registration number and description by make, model, and year of any vehicles to be used by the applicant in connection with the collection or transportation of solid waste in the Municipality;
  - d) A description of the types of solid waste for which a collector's license is sought; and
  - e) An annual license fee of . 1500.00 or as set from time to time by the Administrator.
33. Licensed collectors shall use collection and transportation equipment which:
- 1) Is registered under the Motor Vehicle Act and which complies with all provisions of the Motor Vehicle Act or of any other applicable law in effect from time to time;
  - 2) Is insured for third party liability in such amount as may be required from time to time by the Administrator, proof of which must be provided by the Licensed Collector upon request of the Administration;
  - 3) Is driven by operators with valid operator's permits of the requisite class for that type of vehicle;
  - 4) Is Designed and utilized in a manner which prevents any solid waste from falling out or otherwise being spilled, blown or scattered from the vehicle during collection or transportation, and in particular:
    - a) Must be equipped with a restraining device which shall be closed while the vehicle is in motion; and
    - b) Must be equipped with a cover, tarpaulin or other adequate protective device to prevent solid waste from escaping during collection or transportation; and
  - 5) Is designed, constructed and used in such a manner as to prevent cross-contamination between separated solid waste, if used in the collection of more than one type of solid waste.

#### **Requirements of Licensed Collectors**

34. Licensed collectors shall:

- 1) Immediately notify the Municipality of any change in collector's license status;
- 2) Collect solid waste from the left hand side of the road only, except one-way streets;
- 3) Refuse collection of solid waste which is not separated or otherwise placed for collection in accordance with the requirement of this By-law;
- 4) Ensure that collected solid waste remains separated and uncontaminated by other streams of solid waste prior to delivery at a municipal solid waste management facility;
- 5) Provide instruction to their clients on proper separation of solid waste types, in accordance with this By-law and any other law of Andaman and Nicobar Islands as may be applicable in circumstances;
- 6) Refuse to place industrial waste in areas or containers designated for municipal collection;
- 7) Comply with the provisions of this By-law, including but not restricted to those concerning the placement or deposit of solid waste at municipal solid waste management facilities;
- 8) Comply with any directives or restrictions on collection, transportation routes, or the timing, procedures or methods to be utilized in connection with the collection or disposal of solid waste at a municipal solid waste management facility as may be specified by the Administration from time to time; and
- 9) Attend courses, meetings or training seminars as required from time to time by the Administration regarding the collection and transportation of solid waste, the use of municipal solid waste management facilities and public education pertaining to solid waste management in the Municipality.

### **Refusal, Revocation and Suspension**

- 1) The Administration may refuse to issue, refuse to renew or revoke or suspend a collector's license for breach of this By-Law or of the term or conditions of a collector's license.
- 2) Notice of the Administrator's decision to refusal to issue, refusal to renew or revoke or suspend a collector's license shall be given by regular mail and electronically by fax or e-mail.
- 3) Subject to subsection (2), the Administrator's refusal to issue to renew or revocation or suspension of a collector's license shall be effective seven (7) days following the date that the applicant or collector receives notice of the Administrator's decision by regular mail, fax or by e-mail, to the current mailing address, fax number or e-mail address on file with the Administrator.
- 4) The holder of collector's license in receipt of notice pursuant to subsections (2) and (3) may make an objection to the refusal, revocation or suspension in writing to the Administrator with seven (7) days of the date of effective notice issued pursuant to subsection (3)
- 5) In the event of a willful breach of this by-law by a collector, or the collector's apparent loss of motor vehicle license, registration or insurance the Administrator may, without notice or hearing, suspend a collector's license on reasonable and probable grounds, in which event an interim suspension shall remain in effect for a period of up to thirty (30) days pending a review of circumstances the breach or loss of license, registration or insurance by the Administrator.
- 6) Subject to Subsection (4) any decision regarding the refusal, revocation or suspension of a collector's license made by the Administrator may be reviewed by the Executive Committee of Council upon request of the collector subject to the decision.

## Finance

### Tipping Fees

36.

- a) Fees, called "tipping fees", shall be payable by any individual, business or collector for depositing solid waste at solid waste management facilities.
- b) The amount of a tipping fee and the manner of payment of a tipping fee shall be as determined by Council.

### Other Tipping Fees

37. Where a tipping fee is not addressed by this By-law, including but not restricted to solid waste generated outside the Municipality, the Municipality may:

1. Negotiate a tipping fee by contract with particular solid waste generators, licensed collectors, other municipalities or persons; and
2. By resolution, set a tipping fee of general application, subject to variation by contract.

## Offense and Penalty

### Violation of By-law

38.

- 1) Notwithstanding of this By-law of the Municipality, any person violating any provision of this By-law shall be liable upon conviction to a penalty of not more than ₹. 5000/- and in default of payment thereof to a term imprisonment for not more than 60 days.
- 2) Each day that a person commits an offence under this By-law constitutes a separate offence.

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
