AFFIDAVIT

- I, Ms. Jigmi Choden, Additional Resident Commissioner, Government of Arunachal Pradesh, Arunachal Bhawan, New Delhi do hereby solemnly affirm on oath as under:-
- 1. That I have been authorized APSPCB, Government of Arunachal Pradesh, Itanagar to affirm this affidavit on behalf of the Board on the basis of official documents that have been made available to me and which I believe to be true.
- 2. That this affidavit / status report is being filed pursuant to the directions above mentioned passed by this Hon'ble Tribunal.
- 3. I state that the Arunachal Pradesh State Pollution Control Board in compliance of the Municipal Solid Waste (Management & Handling) Rules 2000 has been submitting the annual reports

basing on the reports received from the Municipals and District Urban development Agencies. The latest being for the year 2013-14 to the Central Pollution Control Board. A copy of the covering letter dated 15/09/2014 alongwith the report is marked and annexed as *Annexure R/1*. The consolidated report is also put on the website of Arunachal Pradesh State Pollution Control Board (www.apspcb.org.in) in compliance of the Hon'ble tribunal Order dated 2nd December, 2014.

4. As a part of the CPCB's programme to create awareness on the implementation of "Municipal Solid Waste (Management & Handling) Rules" and other Environmental related rules, a one day workshop was conducted by the Arunachal Pradesh State Pollution Control Board where officer/official of the Department of Urban Development and Itanagar/Pasighat Municipal Council and Officers from the Health care Facilitators eagerly participated. The report is annexed as *Annexure R/2*.

5.

It is submitted that there are two Municipal Councils in the State, i.e. Itanagar Municipal Council and Pasighat Municipal Council. Apart from this the Department of Urban Development is responsible for the management of MSW in the State where the municipalities have not been set up. There are 18 Urban Divisions in the State and the Department of Urban Development is responsible for the management and handling of MSW as per the provisions laid down under the Municipal Solid Wastes (Management and Handling) Rules, 2000 in these Urban

Divisions. It is further submitted that one Waste Processing and Disposal Facility for the MSW of the Capital Complex is operational at Chimpu, Itanagar.

- 6. That the Municipal Authority of Itanagar/Pasighat and other District Urban Development Agencies of the State are reminded from time to time for furnishing their respective report in prescribed form in time. The Board has also requested the concerned authority to take all the possible steps to comply with the provisions of the Municipal Solid Waste (Management & Handling) Rules, 2000.
- 7. All the Municipal authorities as well as the District Collectors who are responsible for the implementation of the Municipal Solid Waste (Management & Handling) Rules, 2000 are responsible for management of Municipal Solid Waste. The Board is coordinating in all aspects to identify Suitable lands, creating awareness among public for source segregation, establishment of non-biodegradable collection centers in the State.

 - 8. There is no district or village in the entire State of Arunachal Pradesh where the MSW is collected in its entirety, segregated and disposed off in accordance with MSW Rules, 2000. However, it is respectfully submitted that the Itanagar/Pasighat Municipal Council at several places have organized collection of MSW by door to door collection and by using collection bins, forries using

dust bins etc. The Urban Bodies also follow the source segregation of Municipal Solid Wastes in the State.

- 9. That a Cell for monitoring of MSWM system in the State of Arunachal Pradesh has been created in compliance of this Hon'ble Tribunals order dated 05.02.2015 in O.A. No. 199 of 2014.
- 10. It is respectfully submitted that Municipal Solid Waste Management involves an integrated approach which requires technical and financial support considering the numbers of low income group residents in the urban areas. It also requires public co-operation and education for effective implementation apart from strict regulatory measures.

Under the above circumstances, it is most respectfully prayed that this Hon'ble Tribunal may be pleased to pass appropriate orders.

SUMMARY STATEMENT ON PROGRESS MADE BY MUNICIPAL AUTHORITIES IN RESPECT OF IMPLEMENTATION OF SCHEDULE ([RETE 4(3)])

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- The implementation could not be met as scheduled. However, continuous efforts are on for implementation of the parameters.
- One waste processing and disposal facility for the MSW of Capital Complex is operational at Chimpu in Itanagar.
- The Itanagar Municipal Council and Pasignat Mancipal Council have taken over the subject of sanitation from the Department of Urban Development & Housing (UD&H) of Capital Complex and Pasignat respectively. However, the UD&H is responsible for the management and handling of MSW as per the provisions laid down under the Municipal Solid Wastes (Management and Handling) Rules, 2000 in the other remaining urban divisions.
- A Committee headed by the Deputy Commissioner, Capital Complex is constituted to identify dumping/landfill sites for the Capital region.



SUMMARY STATEMENT ON PROGRESS MADE BY MUNICIPAL AUTHORITIES IN RESPECT OF IMPLEMENTATION OF SCHEDULE II [RULES 6(1) AND (3), 7(b)]

1. COLLECTION OF MUNICIPAL SOLID WASTES COMPLIANCE STATUS

- House to house collection facility is done in 1 division. Further, household survey is underway in 1 division to start house to house collection.
- RCC bins, dustbins, Trolleys, dumper placer loader and twin litter boxes of different capacities are installed at various specific locations accessible to the users in the Town for collection of wastes.
- One division has incinerator in the respective hospital for disposal of Bio-medical waste.
- Weekly checking of Slaughter house waste and demolition waste (malba) by DUDA in one of the divisions. While one division have instructed the respective private contractors to clean the demolition wastes (malba) by themselves.

2. SEGREGATION OF MUNICIPAL SOLID WASTES COMPLIANCE STATUS

The Municipal Council Itanagar has conducted meeting with the stakeholders to discuss about the MSW and its management in Capital Complex.


3. STORAGE OF MUNICIPAL SOLID WASTLS COMPLIANCE STATES

- Storage facilities like RCC bins and containers of different specifications sizes are established and put up in specific areas by taking into account the quantities of wastes generation and population densities.
- RCC bins, dustbins, Trolleys, dumper placer loader and twin litter boxes of different capacities are installed at various specific locations accessible to the users in the Town for collection of wastes.
- The wastes are handled manually due to constraints. However, it is carried out under proper precaution and the safety of the workers is taken care of.

4. TRANSPORTATION OF MUNICIPAL SOLID WASTES COMPLIANCE STATUS

- The storage facilities are attended daily for clearing of wastes.
- Vehicles like dumper placer, animal cart, tricycle, refuse collector, TATA Ace with segregated compartment and tipper trucks are used for transportation of wastes to the dumping site.
- Barring some trucks most of the other transportation vehicles do not have waste covering facilities during its transportation.

5. <u>PROCESSING OF MUNICIPAL SOLID WASTES</u> <u>COMPLIANCE STATUS</u>



- Department of UD&H had constructed one waste processing and disposal facility at Chimpu in Itanagar that is operational wherein 50 MT day of wastes are composted.
- Two of the divisions follow vermicomposting and one division follows pelletization.
- Vermicomposting proposal is underway in one division.
- MSW plant is under construction and is likely to complete next year in one of the divisions.

6. <u>DISPOSAL OF MUNICIPAL SOLID WASTES</u> <u>COMPLIANCE STATUS</u>

- Excluding the one waste processing and disposal facility that is operational at Chimpu in Itanagar wastes of all other divisions are disposed in open dumping ground. No landfilling is carried out.
- Landfill site is under construction in one of the divisions.

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SUMMARY STATEMENT ON PROGRESS MADE BY MUNICIPAL AUTHORITIES IN RESPECT OF IMPLEMENTATION OF SCHEDULE III [RULES 6(1) AND (3), 7(2)]

- A Committee headed by the Deputy Commissioner, Capital Complex is constituted to identify dumping/landfill sites for the Capital region.
- The dumping sites are located away from habitation clusters, forest areas, water bodies, monuments, national parks, wetlands and places of important cultural, historical or religious interest.
- We have written to all the Deputy Commissioners of the State to expedite the process for identification of landfill sites.
- We have also written to the Chief Municipal Executive Officer of Itanagar Municipal Council to identify and select a site for landfill site.

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SUMMARY STATEMENT ON PROGRESS MADE BY MUNICIPAL AUTHORITIES IN RESPECT OF IMPLEMENTATION OF SCHLDULT IN [RULES 6(1) AND (3), 7(2)]

One waste processing, treatment and disposal facility located at Chimpu in Itanagar is operational.

REPORT

ONE DAY WORKSHOP ON ENVIRONMENTAL LAWS

Date: 17th February, 2015

Venue: Conference Hall, Paryavaran Bhawan, Yupia Road, Papu Hill, Naharlagun

The Arunachal Pradesh State Pollution Control Board (APSPCB), Naharlagun, Department of Environment & Forests, Government of Arunachal Pradesh conducted a one day workshop on 17th February, 2015 at its conference Hall under the chairmanship of Sri C.D Singh, IFS, Director, State Forest Research Institute (SFRI), Itanagar, The topic of workshop was Municipal Solid Waste (Management & Handling) Rules, Bio-medical Waste (Management & Handling) Rules and Environmental Legislation in India.

The objective of the workshop was to create awareness among the government officers of the Departments of Urban Development and Health and the representatives of the newly created Itanagar Pasighat Municipal Councils about the Municipal Solid Wastes, Bio-medical Wastes and hazard it pose. The participants were educated about the problems of the Municipal Solid Wastes and Bio-medical wastes and the rules framed for its handling and disposal mechanism. Thrust was given on source segregation of the waste.

Sri N. Tam, IFS, Member Secretary, APSPCB in his speech deliberated on the power and functions of the board and roles it plays to minimize environmental pollution.

An interaction session was also conducted where Environmental Laws vis-a vis issues related to pollution of environment were discussed upon. The one day workshop was attended by Swami Vedavidyananda from R.K. Mission, Itanagar, Er Gyamar Tachung Dy Director(UD), Er Tolya Tache, Dy Director(UD), Sri Yumlam Achung, President , IWMA, Er Chakpu Raju, Ms Mama Tang, Sri Lichi Tomi, Sri Taba Takha, Sri Debia Suraj, Sri Pexom Jini from Itanagar Municipal Council and Dr K. Ete from General Hospital, Naharlagun.
