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AFFIDAVIT ON BEHALF OF THE MADHYA PRADESH POLLUTION CONTROL BOARD/RESPONDENT

Most Respectfully Showeth:

(1) That, the Hon'ble Tribunal vide its order dated 02.12.2014 passed in the abovementioned matter directed the Central Pollution Control Board (CPCB) to compile the status reports filed by the State Pollution Control Boards (SPCB) and the respective State Governments and the Union Territories and file one consolidated status report in regard to collection and disposal of municipal solid waste. A copy of the order dated 02.12.2014 passed by the Hon'ble Tribunal in O.A. No. 199 of 2014 is annexed herewith and marked as ANNEXURE A – 1.

- (2) That the Government of India in order to regulate the management and handling of the municipal solid wastes promulgated Municipal Solid Wastes (Management and Handling) Rules, 2000 (hereinafter referred as 'Rules of 2000').
- (3) That Rule 4 of the Rules of 2000, specifically provides that it is the duty of the municipal authority for implementation of the rules and for any infrastructure development for collection, storage, segregation, transportation, processing and disposal of the municipal solid wastes.
- (4) That Rule 5 of the Rules of 2000 specifies that it is the duty of the District Magistrate or the Deputy Commissioner of the concerned district to enforce the provisions of these rules. Rule 5 (2) of the Rules of 2000 casts upon a duty on the District Magistrate or the Deputy Commissioner of the concerned district for the enforcement of the provisions of the Rules of 2000 within their territorial limits.
- (5) That Rule 6 of the Rules of 2000, casts upon a duty on the State Pollution Control Board (Madhya Pradesh Pollution Control Board in the present case) to monitor the compliance of the standards regarding ground water, ambient air, leachate quality and the compost quality including incineration standards as specified under Schedules II, III and IV.

- (6) That Rule 8 of the Rules of 2000 casts upon a duty on the State Pollution Control Board to prepare and submit to the Central Pollution Control Board an annual report with regard to the implementation of the rules. The Madhya Pradesh Pollution Control Board (MPPCB) has already submitted the annual report of 2013-2014 which has been acknowledged by the CPCB in its consolidated report dated 02.12.2014 and even mentioned in the order dated 02.12.2014 of the Hon'ble Tribunal.
- (7) That, the CPCB in its consolidated report dated 02.12.2014 with respect to overall implementation of the Rules of 2000 in the State of Madhya Pradesh has submitted that 4 Municipal Authorities namely Singrauli, Rewa, Chattarpur and Panna have installed compost plant. Municipal Corporation Gwalior and Indore has commissioned waste processing and the disposal facilities. Municipal Corporation Jabalpur has also commissioned kathonda landfill site and is in operation since March, 2011. Cantonment Board Sagar and Municipal Corporation Sagar has given contracts to the private agencies for making manure through composting. Nagar Palika Parishad Dabra has started landfill site during 2010-2011. DPR has been submitted by 91 Municipal Authorities but no substantial progress in setting up of waste processing and disposal facility.

- (8) That with respect to monitoring of the facilities entrusted with the processing and the disposal of the waste, the finding of the CPCB with respect to MPPC was that in absence of operation of processing, disposal and storage facility by any one of the municipal authorities in accordance with the Rules of 2000, the monitoring of these facilities not taken up till the facilities are actually made functional by the Municipal Authorities of the State of M.P. Even then, the MPPCB has conducted the water and ambient air quality monitoring at the facilities as well as the dumping sites which have started operation. All field officers are also instructed to ensure monitoring at all dumping sites.
 - (9) That the CPCB in paragraph 6.16 of its consolidated report dated 02.12.2014 has outlined certain tasks for the State Pollution Control Board which are being performed by the M.P. Pollution Control Board through the following steps and measures:
 - (i) The M.P. Pollution Control Board (MPPCB) vide its letter dated 13.03.2014 has written to the all the Municipal Authorities to prepare and submit the detailed project report highlighting collection, segregation, storage, treatment and disposal of wastes. A true copy of the letter dated 13.03.2014 issued by the MPPCB is annexed herewith and marked as ANNEXURE A 2.

- (ii) The M.P. Pollution Control Board (MPPCB) extend all help and expertise in setting up the waste processing/disposal facilities either by the municipalities or engaging private entrepreneurs as and when so required.
- (iii) The M.P. Pollution Control Board (MPPCB) will submit the annual status report in accordance with Rule 8 of the Rules of 2000 to the CPCB submitting the complete information relating to the implementation of the Rules of 2000 by the concerned State Government Authorities.
- (iv) That the M.P. Pollution Control Board (MPPCB) in compliance of Rule 5 of the Rules of 2000 monitors the site of waste processing and disposal facilities and submits its recommendations to the CPCB in the annual status report. A copy of the Annual Status Report for the year 2013-2014 submitted by the M.P. Pollution Control Board (MPPCB) to the CPCB is annexed herewith and marked as ANNEXURE A 3.
- (v) That the M.P. Pollution Control Board (MPPCB) organizes workshops and seminars to make aware the general public about the collection and segregation of the wastes. A copy of the chart showing the workshop organized by the MPPCB in the year 2013 and 2014 is annexed herewith and marked as ANNEXURE A 4.

- (vi) That the M.P. Pollution Control Board (MPPCB) under Section 15 of the Environment Protection Act 1986 have been initiated action against Municipal Corporation Rewa, Katni, Indore, Ujjain and Dewas for violation of provisions of Rules of 2000 to ensure compliance of the provisions of Rules of 2000.
- respectfully submits that the Board is committed for the implementation of the provisions of the Rules of 2000 in true letter and spirit and will abide the directions if any, issued by this Hon'ble Tribunal with respect to the effective implementation of the Rules of 2000.

•	Boards have filed their status reports while some of the States have failed to comply with our directions. It is

Jammu & Kashmir, UT Daman Diu, Assam, Jharkhand, Karnataka and UT Lakshyadeep, Tamil Nadu and Uttar Pradesh failed to comply. Learned counsel appearing for these States/ State Pollution Control Boards are granted two weeks time by way of last opportunity to file the status reports in regard to collection and disposal of municipal solid waste in their respective States. The Report shall be filed before the CPCB which then shall file the final status reports in regard to all the States and UTs in the Country.

Learned counsel appearing for CPCB submits that an interim status report has been prepared. Let the same be filed within two days from today. Copy of the same shall be put on the website of the CPCB and the Board shall ensure that the website is downloadable forthwith at the point of time at which it is uploaded. The status reports shall also be gut on the website of the respective States/ State Boards.

We also direct all the State Governments to study the Judgment of the Tribunal in the case of Capt. Mall Singh & Ors. Vs. Punjab PCB dors. - Appeal No. 70 of 2012 on 25th November, 2014 which deals with the methodology and steps that are to be taken by the States/ State Boards for collection and disposal of municipal solid waste. If any suggestion are to be moved by the parties in relation to the said judgment it should be moved within two weeks from today to the Registry of the Tribunal.

List this case for further directions and arguments on 15th January, 2015.

The copy of this Order will be sent to the Chief Secretary of all the States and Member Secretaries of the respective Boards. We make it clear that the said Authority shall be personally liable for compliance of this Order. Whereas; the M. P. Pollution Control Board is vested with powers to enforce Municipal Solid Waste (Management & Handling) Rules, 2000 in the State of Madhya Pradesh and also issue directions u/s 5 of Environment (Protection) Act, 1986 as and when required.

Whereas; Municipal Authorities in the State of Madhya Pradesh are governed by Deptt. of Urban Administration & Development Department (UADD) and are responsible for the implementation of the provisions of Municipal Solid Waste (Management & Handling) Rules, 2000 including directions/guidelines issued by the apex environmental authorities i.e. MoEF, GoI, CPCB and MPPCB.

Whereas; some of the important provisions of the MSW Rules, 2000 are as follows:

1. Rules 4 (2):

To obtain authorization for setting/operation of waste processing and disposal facilities including landfills.

2. Rules 4 (1)

Every Municipal Authority is responsible for the implementation of the provisions of MSW Rules, 2000 including infrastructure development, for collection, storage, segregation, transportation, processing and disposal of municipal solid waste.

3. Rules 4 (3)

Road map for implementation of compliance criteria for provision of MSW rules needs to be complied with as per schedule-1 of MSW Rules.

Municipal Authority shall submit annual report in Form-2 of MSW rules.

5. Rules 7 (1)
Municipal Authority shall manage and handle MSW as per schedule-II of MSW Rules.

6. Rules 7 (2)
Waste processing and disposal facility should be made to comply with the specifications and standards given in schedule-III & IV of MSW Rules.

7. Rules 9
Municipal Authority are required to submit reports regarding accidents occurred in Form-IV of MSW rules regarding accidents at waste disposal facilities and during collection, segregation, transportation, processing etc.

Whereas; CPCB has prepared guidelines for implementation of municipal solid wastes and circulated to all the State Governments and SPCBs for effective implementation of MSW Rules. Also MPPCB circulated the copy of the guidelines to UADD, GoMP, all the municipal authorities vide letter dated: 16/01/14.

Whereas; MoEF GoI vide its letter dated: 13/12/12 issued a circular with 10 nos. of detailed directions for proper implementation of MSW Rules by the municipal authorities. The MPPCB further forwarded this circular to UADD, GoMP and Housing & Environment Deptt. Govt. of M.P. to aware the government regarding the directions of MoEF. These directions/action points/recommendations are as follows:

- 1. All the municipal authority shall identify the land fill site and acquire the land for development of waste processing and disposal facility.
- 2. Improvement of existing landfill site as per provision of MSW Rules.
- 3. Any municipal solid waste generated in a city or a town, shall be managed and handled in accordance with the compliance criteria and the procedure laid down in schedule-II by the municipal authority.
- 4. The waste processing and disposal facilities to be setup by the municipal authority on their own or through an operator of a facility shall meet the specification and standards as specified in schedule-III and IV.
- 5. The Municipal authority shall make an application in Form-I to obtain authorization for setting up waste processing and disposal facility including landfills with time bound action plan detail project report, and compliance of conditions given in authorization.
- 6. The municipal authority shall submit its annual report in Form-II with a copy to the State Board before 30th June every year.
- 7. A Technical cell at state level may be setup to provide assistance to the local bodies enabling them to the decisions on implementation on MSW rules, particularly relating the setting up of waste processing and disposal facilities.
- 8. Guidelines on selection of waste processing and disposal technologies option, model agreements for private sector participation in solid waste management etc. need to be widely circulated to the ULB's.
- 9. State may evolve their own plans and polices to provide technological and financial assistance to the local bodies.
- 10. Mass awareness campaigns and seeking private sector participation in solid waste management.

Whereas; MPPCB is making all efforts to intimate, aware, train and explain the provisions of MSW rules since 2000 to all the municipal authorities from time to time by issuing letters, reminders, mandatory directions and notices etc. Also 02 cases are filed against some of the municipal authorities for violation of the provisions of MSW Rules.

Whereas; as per the current status of compliance of MSW Rules, the annual report 2012-13 clearly mentions that:

Whereas; it is observed that 302 nos. of municipal authorities have utterly failed to comply with the conditions of provisional authorization issued by MPPCB and has not renewed the authorization upto date. Remaining 63 nos. of municipal authorities even not obtained authorization as yet and are running illegally.

In light of the above fact and now, therefore, in exercise of powers conferred upon under section 5 of the Environment (Protection) Act, 1986, it is hereby directed as follows:

- that all the District Collectors shall be directed to enforce the MSW Rules, 2000 being the overall responsible authority for enforcement of MSW Rules as per Rule 5 (2) of the said act.
- 2. that all the Municipal Authorities shall be directed to submit a time bound action plan for compliance of MSW Rules within 03 weeks from the date of issue of these directions.
- 3. that all the municipal authorities shall be directed to obtain authorization for management of municipal solid waste in accordance with the provisions of Municipal Solid Waste (Management & Handling) Rules, 2000 and renew the authorization upto date for legal operation of the services.

existing landfill sites if already acquired/cap the old sites if required.

 that all the municipal authorities shall be directed to make effective arrangement for door to door collection of Municipal Solid Waste including segregation, transportation, processing etc.

7. that all the municipal authorities shall be directed to comply with the guidelines and directions of MoEF GoI and CPCB by first preparing the time bound action plan and implementing the same within stipulated time period. The copy of the guidelines and direction of MoEF/CPCB are enclosed herewith for ready reference.

8. that all the municipal authorities shall be directed to submit the annual report and the

report of accident as per Rule 4 (4) and Rule 9 regularly.

9. that proper policy, procedure and budgetary provision be made for municipal authorities for enforcement of MSW Rules, 2000

6. A Summary statement on progress made by municipal authorities in respect of implementation of schedule III [Rule6(1) and (3),7(2)]

It is mentioned that out of 364 local bodies, 308 local bodies have identified land for MSW disposal. Out of 308 local bodies, 239 local bodies have been allotted land site for MSW disposal. However only 135 local bodies have obtained possession. Municipal corporation Gwallor and M.C. Indore has setup waste processing and disposal facilities. Nagar Palika Dabra has also started land fill-site Municipal corporation 2010-11. Jabalpur has completed construction of one cell of land fill site and has started since march 2011. Municipal Corporation Jabalpur. has also made an agreement with Essel Jabalpur MSW (P) Ltd., regarding waste processing plant on Boot basis but field work is yet to start. At Ujjaln 08 local bodies has partially developed disposal sites. Municipal Corporation Ujjain has also proposed mechanical composting plant. Municipal Corporation Sagar and Nagar Palika Parishad Chhatarpur has developed site for processing and disposal of MSW. Municipal Corporation Satna and Nagar Parished Chitrakoot have developed the land fill site. Municipal installed also has Corporation Satna plan Phased composting plant. construction and closure of site is not given to the Board. Also action plan for making the landfill site functional have not submitted by most of the Municipal Authorities as per the provision of MSW Rules, even after issuing Directions u/s 5 of EPA Rules.

7. A Summary statement on progress made by municipal authorities in respect of implementation of schedule IV [Rule6 (1) and (3), 7(1)]
