NOTES FOR HON'BLE GREEN TRIBUNAL FROM GUWAHATI MUNICIPAL CORPORATION

Introduction:-

The State of Assam has 27 districts and there are 95 ULBs with in it. It has one Municipal Corporation viz Guwahati Municipal Corporation (GMC) and rest as Town Committees and Municipal Boards.

Solid Waste Management(SWM) History:- Till the year 2003 SWM in Assam was collection of garbage from the road side\markets and dumping in a low lying places designated as dump yard. However with the stipulations of MSW (management and handling) rules 2000 attempt was made for erection of a SWM structure in Guwahati Municipal Corporation(GMC). But finance was a major issue then. All the ULBs including GMC was cash starved and taking up of detailed SWM as per the rules was beyond capacity. A Consultant was engaged for preparation of Detailed project Report(DPR) for SWM of Guwahati city for funding of DONER Ministry in the year 2006. Finally MOUD approved the DPR and agreed to finance the "Integrated Solid waste Management Project for Guwahati" in the year 2008 under Jnnurm. The DPR was approved for a cost of Rs 102.0 crore and Govt funding was about Rs 32.5 crores and rest amount to be brought up through Public- Private Pertnership(P-P-P) mode. Concession Agreement was signed with M/s Ramkey Enviro Enginnersin PPP mode and the SWM for the Guwahati city was handed over to them in the year 2008. As per the approved scheme M/s Ramkey was authorised to

- Collect waste from house to house.
- Transport waste without multiple handling
- Setting up of a 200 Tonnes per day(TPD) compost plant
- A waste to Energy Plant using RDF(Refused Derived Fuel)
- A Sanitary Land fill for the inert waste.

Govt of Assam allotted 120 bighas of land at West Baragaon for setting up of the Composting, Waste to Energy and land fill facilities.

However the performance of the Private partner (M/s Ramkey) was not up to the mark and kept on detoriating leading to cancellation of the concession agreement in the year 2014.



Present scenario:-

- A. ULBs except GMC:- From 2nd October 2014 (birth day of Mahatma Gandhiji) entire state is, implementing the MANASA(Mukhya Mantrir Asomor Nirmal aru Seuj Abijan) Programme under which special emphasis are made on SWM and sanitation. All the ULBs have procured tri-cycle vans and handcarts for collection of Solid waste. The Entire system of SWM have been geared up under the direct supervision of the respective Deputy commissioners.
- B. Guwahati Municipal Corporation:- After the termination of the Agreement with M/s ramkey
 The Guwahati Municipal Corporation has taken up the SWM in the following phases
 - Primary collection:- There are 31 Municipal wards in Guwahati. There are ward committees for each ward under the chairmanship of each ward councillor. A NGO has been selected and entrusted with the work of primary collection for each ward. The work of the NGO are supervised by the ward committee. NGOs for each ward are authorised to collect user charges from the waste generators. NGOs also sweeps the secondary streets under each ward. This scheme of using NGOs has been successful so far.
 - Transportation:- A total nos of 200 garbage bins are placed in the city in various location for collection of waste .GMC has 12 nos of garbage compactor of 14.0 cum capacity along with 10 JCBs, 6 mini loaders and a fleet of 30 tippers of various capacity. Using the aforesaid machineries &vehicles GMC is lifting &transporting 600 tonnes of waste per day. To augment the capacity another 10 nos of Garbage compactor trucks are ordered and is expected to be supplied with in March 2015. Further process is on for procurement of few stationary compactors. There are proposal for construction of 3 nos of transfer station in the city out of which one in nearing completion at RG Baruah road.
 - Waste processing and treatment facilities:- GMC has 120 bighas of land under its
 disposal for construction of Waste processing and treatment facilities. At present a
 composting plant of 50 Tonnes per day is operational with civil work for another
 150 tonnes per day capacity is nearly completed. Further there are plans for
 installation of other treatment facilities

ACT

son-biodegradable garbagetin public drains, road, wet lands, wastelands, water bodies, places—open to public view, to regulate the use of non-biodegradable material and for matters connected therewith or incidental thereto

Preamble

Whereas it is expedient to provide for prevention of throwing or depositing non-biodegradable garbage in public drains, roads, wet land wasteland, water bodies, places open to public view all over the areas under the Guwahati Municipal Corporation and the Guwahati Metropolitan Development Authority to regulate the use of non-biodegradable material, in the manner hereinafter appearing;

It is hereby enacted in the Fifty-seventh Year of the Republic of India as follows:-

Short title, extent and commence ment

- (1) This Act may be called the Guwahati Non-biodegradable Garbage (Control and Prevention) Act, 2006.
 - (2) It extends to the whole of the area under the Guwahati Municipal Corporation and the Guwahati Metropolitan Development Authority.

Definitions

in this Act, unless the context otherwise requires,

(a) "bio-degradable garbage" means the garbage or washed materials capable of being destroyed by the activity of living beings.

- (b) 'competent authority' means any authority, officer or person appointed by the State Government, by notification in the official Gazette, for enforcement of any provision of this Act;
- (c) "garbage receptacle" means the common bin placed in a public place or any other convenient place for collection of waste in a manifer so as to prevent litering, attraction to vectors, stray animals and excessive foul odour;
- (d) "State Government" means the Government of Assam,
- (e) "house-guily" means a passage or strip of land constructed, set apart or utilised for the purpose of serving as or carrying a drain or offering access to the latrine, urinel, cesspit or other receptacle for filth or other polluted matter by persons employed in the clearing thereof or in the removal of such matter therefrom;
- (f) "local authority" means the Guwahati Municipal Corporation and the Guwahati Metropolitan Development Authority constituted under the Guwahati Municipal Corporation Act, 1969 and the Guwahati Metropolitan Development Authority Act, 1985.

- (g) "market" means any place where persons assemble of exposing for sale of meat, fish, fruits, vegetables, food or any other articles for human use or consumption with or without the consent of owner of such places, notwithstanding that there may be no common regulation for the concourse of the buyers and the sellers and whether or not any control is exercised over the business of, for the persons frequenting the tharket by the owner of the place or by any other persons.
- (h) "non-blodegradable garbage" means the garbage or washed materials made up of non-blodegradable materials and not capable of being destroyed by the activity of living beings or by biological natural process which remains in the environment for a long period of time and has potential to harm eco-system;
 - (i) "non-blodegradable material" means the material which gannot be decomposed or degraded by action of micro-organisms, sunlight or other natural action and includes goods made or manufactured from polyethylene, nylon or other plastic substances such as poly-viny-chloride (PVC), poly-propylane and polystyrene, specified in the Schedule to this Act.
 - (j) "place open to public view" includes any private place or building, public offices, but, monument status, water pipe line, structure, wall including compound wall, retaining wall tree, fence post, pole or any other erection or contrivance visible to person being in or passing along, any public place.

- (k) "publicaplaces means, any place including a road, street or way whether a thoroughfare or not and a landing place to which the public are granted access or have a right to recorb or over which they have a right to pass;
- (I) "writing" includes decoration, lettering, ornamentations, drawing carcature and other modes for representing or reproducing words or figures in visible form.
- (m) "occupier" includes --
 - (i) any personswho for the time being is paying or is liable to pay to the owner the rentior any portion of the rent of the land or building in respect of which such rent is paid or is payable;
 - (ii) an owner in occupation of or otherwise using his land or an building;
 - (III) a rent free tenant of any land or building; and
 - (iv) any person who is liable to pay the owner, damages for the use of occupation of any land or building:
- '(n) "owner" includes a person who for the time being is receiving or is entitleditorreceive the rent of any land or building, whether on his own account or of other person or as an agent, trustee, guardian or receiver or any other person who should so receive the rention be entitled to receive it if the land or building or partithereof were let to a tenant;
- (o) "prescribed" means prescribed by rules made under this Act :
- (p) "Public Analyst" means the persons appointed by the State
 Government in a laboratory established or recognized by the
 State, as Public Analyst;
- (q) "wetland" includes ewamps; and marshes, well grass land and pit lands, estuaries, deltas and phar areas mangroves, westelands and creeks and human made sites such as fish ponds, rice paddies, reservoirs and beels.

Prohibition to throw biodegradable and non-biodegradable garbage

3.(1) No person by himself or through another, shall knowingly or otherwise, throw or cause to be thrown, in any drain vantilation, shaft, pipe and fittings connected with the private or public drainage works, natural or man made lakes, wetland, any non-biodegradable garbage or construction debris, or any blodegradable garbage by planting in a non-bio-degradable bag or container likely to—

(I) injure the drainage and sewerage (Con.)

(iii) be dangerous or cause nuisance or be prejudical to the public health; and

(iv) damage the lake, river water or wetland.

No person shall knowingly or observer, place or permit to be placed, except in accordance with such placedure or after complying with such safeguards as two be prescribed, any biodegradable or non-bio-degradable gailings in any public place or in a place open to public view, unless.

(a) the garbage is placed in a garbage receptacle;(b) the garbage is deposited in a location designated by a local authority having jurisdiction on an area for the disposal of such gastrops.

Restriction OF prohibition or use of certain nonblodegradable material

(1) The State Government may, by notification in the Official Gazette, impose restriction or prohibition on the use of nonbiodegradable material, or any other material harmful to environment within the Guwahati Municipal Corporation area and the Guwahati Metropolitan Development Authority area, which is contrary to the norms, saithe State Government may,

by notification in the Official Gazatte, specify.

(2) The State Government may, by general or special order, impose requirements on manufacturers, distributors, and other persons who produce or handle commodities, with respect to the type, size, thickness, labeling and composition of packaging with respect to its use and disposal including standards or norms for material degradability and re-cyclability.

Provision for placement of receptacle and places for deposit of nonbiodegradable garbade and establishment of waste collection system

It shall be the duty of the local authority, or any officer authorized 5.

(a) place or provide or place in proper and convenient situation public receptacles, depots or places for temporary deposit or collection of non-blodegradable garbage;

(b) provide separate dustbins for temporary deposit of non-biodegradable garbage other than those kept and maintained for deposit of bio-degradable garbage;

(c) provide for the removal of contents of receptacles, deposit and of the accumulation at all places provided or appointed by it under clause (a); and

(d) arrange for recycling of the non-biodegradable garbage so collected by local body or through private agencies.

Duty of the owners and occupiers to collect and deposit nonplodegradable garbage etc.

Itishall be the duty of the owners and occupiers of every 6. land and building to -

(I) collect or to cause to be collected from their respective land and building the non-biodegradable garbage and to deposit, or cause to be deposited in garbage receptacles, deposits or places provided for temporary deposits or collection of the nonblodegradable garbage by the local authority concerned in the

(ii) provide separate garbage receptacles, other than those kept and maintained for deposit of blo-degredable gartiage, of the type and in the manner specified by the local authority or its officers for collection therein of all the non-biodegradable waste from such land and building and to keep such receptacles or dustoins in good condition and repair

Power of local authority or competent authority to remove nonbiodegradable garbage or nonbiodegradable material

Power of entry and inspection

The local authority or the Competent Authority may, after giving notice in writing to the owner or occupier or part-owner or person claiming to be the owner or part-owner of any land or building, which has become a place of unauthorized stacking or deposit of non-biodegradable garbage or non-biodegradable material which is likely to cause a nuisance or is likely to injure the drainage and sewerage system or is likely to be dangerous to life and health, remove or cause to be removed the garbage or material so stacked or collected, or take such steps as it may think necessary and dispose of the said garbage or material at the cost of such person in the manner as provided under sub-section (5) of section 8.

THE RESERVE OF THE PARTY OF THE

- (1) Subject to the provision of this section, any person empowered by the State Government, by notification in the Official Gazette or any person so authorized by the Guwahati Municipal Corporation or the Guwahati Metropolitan Development Authority, shall have a right to enter, at all reasonable times with such assistance as he donsiders necessary, any place, for the purpose of -
 - (i) performing any of the functions entrusted to him by the State Government; or
 - (ii) determining whether, and if so, in what manner, any such functions are to be performed, or whether any provisions of this Act or the rules made thereunder, or any notice, order or direction served, made or, given under this Act, is being , or has been compiled with; or
 - (iii) examining any record, register, document or any other material object or for conducting a search of any building in which he has reason to believe that an offence under this Act or the rules made thereunder has been, or is being, or is about to be committed, and for seizing such, record, register, document or other material object if he has reason to believe that it may furnish evidence of the commission of offence punishable under this Act or the rules made thereunder.
 - (2) Every person handling any non-biodegradable material or nonblodegradable garbage, shall be bound to render all assistance to the person empowered under sub-section (1) for carrying out the functions under that sub-section, and if he falls to do so without any reasonable cause of excuse, he shall be liable to be punished under this Act.

(4) The provisions of Code of Criminal Procedure, 1973, shall, so far as may be, apply to any search or seizure under this section as they apply to any search or seizure made under the authority of a warrant issued under section 94 of the said Code.

Central Act 2 of 1974

(6) Any non-biodegradable garbage or non-biodegradable material seized under this section, shall be disposed of in the prescribed manner.

Penalty

- Whoever contravenes any of the provisions of this Act or any rules, notification or order made under this Act for throwing of biodegradable garbage or use of non-biodegradable garbage or restricted use of certain non-biodegradable, material shall, on conviction, be punished —
- (a) for the first offence with a fine which may extend to two thousand rupees;
- (b) for the second offence with a fine which may extend to five thousand rupees;
- (c) for the subsequent offence, with an imprisonment for a term which may extend to three months and with a fine which may extend to twenty-five thousand rupees;
- (2) Whoever in any manner aids, abets or is accessory to the commission of an offence under this Act, shall, on conviction, be punished with the punishment provided for the offence.

Offences by companies

10. (1) If the person committing any offence punishable under this Act is a company, every person, who, at the time of the commission of the offence, was in-charge of and responsible to the company for the conduct of the business of the company, as well as the company, shall be deemed to be guilty of the offence and shall be liable to be proceeded against and punished accordingly:

Provided that, nothing contained in this sub-section shall render any such person liable to any punishment provided in this Act if he proves that the offence was committed without his knowledge or that he exercised all due diligence to prevent the commission of the offence.

(2) Notwithstanding anything contained in sub-section (1), where an offence under this Act has been committed by a company and it is proved that the offence has been committed with the consent or connivance of, or attributable to any gross negligence on the part of , any director, manager, secretary or other officer of the company, such director, manager, secretary or other officer shall also be deemed to be guilty of that offence and shall be liable to be proceeded against and punished accordingly.
