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AFFIDAVIT ON BEHALF OF STATE OF CHHATTISGARH IN REPLY TO SHOW CAUSE DATED 07.02.2017

AMIT BAJRATESETTLY officiating as Superintending Engineer, Directorate of Urban Notary/Advocate RAIPUR (C.G.) Inhumstration and Development, Government of Chhattisgarh do REGD No. C.G.-1/Raipur Per Solemnly affirm as under that, I am the OiC of the case and as 10/05/2013

 In its order dated 07th February 2017 in the instant matter, this Tribunal was pleased to order as follows:

> "After pronouncement of the Judgment of the Tribunai dated 22nd December, 2016 in the Case of Almitra H. Patel & Anr. Vs. Union of India & Ors. in Original Application No. 199 of 2014, vide our order dated 12th January, 2017, we had issued Notice to all the State Governments. Union Territories, Pollution Control Boards, Local Authorities of the respective States to show cause why appropriate directions be not passed by the Tribunal to ensure compliance of the Judgment. Further these Authorities were directed to file complete and detailed Action Plan and affidavits to show how the municipal solid waste in the State would be processed and degradation of environment and public health resulting therefrom would be prevented. All the States except the State of Goa and the State of Tripura have not filed the required affidavit and the Action Pian as contemplated under the order of the Tribunal, as it must all the States has not cared to file affidavit and Action Plan as direction. As part of this Action Plan they would also required to submit a total solid waste generated and how that solid waste was required to be

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treated in a time bound manner in regard to this directions. None of the States have bothered to file affidavit or the Action Plan.

Be that as it may, it is a matter of utmost importance and require all the stakeholders not only to show their concern but even to take appropriate action without any delay now at least. Thus, we direct that all the States should comply these directions within two weeks from today, if not already complied with." (sic)

- In response to the above, the respondent State of Chhattisgarh, begs to submit as follows:
 - (1) That the State of Chhattisgarh has initiated action to address the issue of scientific disposal of municipal solid waste in all 168 municipal towns in the State.

That detailed action plans are ready in respect of certain municipal towns and in process of preparation in other towns.

That an abstract of the State-wide Action Plan and Progress Report prepared as on 31st January 2017 in respect of all 168 towns is being submitted with this affidavit as R/1 which the Tribunal may please take on record.

That the key points of the Action Plan include the following:

- Three approaches have been adopted in 168 towns. In Raipur, the waste-to-energy approach is adopted; in two towns, namely, Bilaspur and Bhilai, the RDF approach has been adopted; and in remaining 165 towns, the SLRM model as successfully developed in Ambikapur, is being adopted.
- ii. That the SLRM Ambikapur Model is a variant of and a more rationalized approach to the RDF model. It involves RDF (as Cooking Gas from organic waste) only as a last resort for the residual organic waste, left after all the 'resources' have been sorted out. The resources sorted are such items that are directly recyclable and command a higher sale price in the market. These include egg shells, peels of certain fruits like sweet lemon etc.

- iii. That the Action Plan is proposed to be implemented through the PPP mode in most cases. In Bhilai, the municipal body is implementing the project in collaboration with Bhilai Steel Plant.
- iv. That action on implementation of the plan has already started in all 168 towns and will be completed at different dates; and that the last date for completion is June 2019.

That the State of Chhattisgarh is committed to implement (5) the Action Plan In all earnestness to give effect to the provisions contained in the SWM Rules 2016 and the orders of this Tribunal from time to time.



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
