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**Affidavit on behalf of Respondent Urban Development Department,  
State of Maharashtra**

I, Shri Sudhakar D. Bobade, Deputy Secretary, Urban Development Department, Government of Maharashtra, Mumbai 400032, do hereby state on solemn affirmation that I am filing this Affidavit in the aforesaid matter in pursuance to the orders passed by this Hon'ble Tribunal on 22<sup>nd</sup> December, 2016.

1. I say and submit that the State Government is committed towards scientific management of Municipal Solid Waste. As per the Annual Report under Solid Waste Management Rules, 2016 for the year 2015-16 published by the Maharashtra Pollution Control Board in the state of Maharashtra there are total 262 Urban local bodies, comprising of 26 Municipal Corporations, 13- 'A' Class Municipal Council, 57- 'B' Class Municipal Council, 151- 'C' Class Municipal Council, 09- Nagar Panchayat, 06-Cantonment Board generating about **21,867.27** metric tons of municipal solid waste every day, of which the contribution in terms of percentage by the corporation is 86.74 %, by 'A' class council is 3.09%, by 'B' class council is 4.94 % , by 'C' Class Council is 4.58 % and by



Others is 0.64 %. The overall percentage of treatment is 31 % i.e. 6690.88 MT/day quantity. The present status of urban local bodies is enclosed and marked as Annexure -I. The Region wise abstract along with summary statement is as below:

2. I further say and submit that, In addition to these 262 urban local bodies in year 2015-16 Government of Maharashtra has formed 121 new urban local bodies. These new urban local bodies are mainly taluka headquarters. Information about these newly formed urban local bodies is not included in Maharashtra Pollution Control Board annual report 2015-16. However we have consider these newly formed urban local bodies in State Action Plan.

3. I say and submit that presently the State is in the process of preparation of State Policy on Solid Waste Management in accordance with the provisions of the Solid Waste Management Rules 2016. Following are the main focus areas:

- 3.1. Segregation of waste at source in three categories as per Solid Waste Management Rules 2016 – Biodegradable, Non-biodegradable and domestic hazardous.
- 3.2. Recycling and recovery of materials through promoting material recovery facilities in city.
- 3.3. Decentralized treatment of organic waste in hotels, gardens, vegetable markets etc.
- 3.4. 100% segregated collection and transportation of waste to treatment facility
- 3.5. 100% scientific treatment of waste through composting, vermicomposting, bio-methanization etc. followed by scientific land filling
- 3.6. Involvement of rag pickers and community for achieving maximum level of segregation at source and material recovery from waste.
- 3.7. Ban on plastic less than 50 Micron to reduce the quantity of non-recyclable plastics.
- 3.8. Committees under chairmanship of District Magistrate for identification of suitable clusters of Urban Local Bodies and land for the cluster level treatment facilities.

4. I say and submit that the State has also identified appropriate clusters of Urban Local Bodies for implementation of Waste to Energy projects for inorganic fraction of waste.



5. I further say and submit that the State has created a separate Directorate "Swachh Maharashtra Mission (Urban)" for implementation of Swachh Bharat Mission in Maharashtra with necessary infrastructure and support from national and international agencies. The copy of Government Resolution dated 24.4.2015 is enclosed and marked as Annexure- II . Swachh Maharashtra Mission is supporting and providing guidance to all Urban Local Bodies in the state for implementation of Solid Waste Management projects. Under Swachh Bharat Mission each Urban Local Body will have to prepare and implement Solid Waste Management Detailed Project Report. The Detailed Project Reports to be prepared under Swachh Bharat Mission will be in line with Solid Waste Management Rules 2016 and as per the Swachh Bharat Mission guidelines. Following actions have already been taken by the State for effective implementation of Solid Waste Management under Swachh Bharat Mission:

5.1. To ensure that all provisions of Solid Waste Management Rules 2016 are incorporated in Detailed Project Report, state has appointed empanelled consultants for each division of the state to prepare Solid Waste Management Detailed Project Reports.

5.2. German International Cooperation (GIZ) is supporting Swachh Maharashtra Mission for quality control of Solid Waste Management Detailed Project Report through capacity building, preliminary review of Detailed Project Reports etc.

5.3. To ensure that all Solid Waste Management Detailed Project Reports are in line with Solid Waste Management Rules 2016 State has appointed Maharashtra Jeevan Pradhikaran (MJP)



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for Technical Sanction of Solid Waste Management Detailed Project Reports prepared by Urban Local Bodies


- 5.4. State has also appointed National Environmental Engineering Research Institute (NEERI) for appraisal of Detailed Project Reports (DPR) to ensure quality of DPR and to check that all provisions of Solid Waste Management Rules 2016 are considered during DPR preparation.
- 5.5. Each Urban Local Body will get 49% grant of total DPR cost under Swachh Bharat Mission. To ensure that the Urban Local Bodies have sufficient funds for implementation the State has further directed the Urban Local Bodies to use grants available under the 14th Finance Commission for implementation of Solid Waste Management projects.
- 5.6. Solid Waste Management Detailed Project Reports prepared under Swachh Bharat Mission will be approved by the High Power Committee (HPC) constituted under the chairmanship of Chief Secretary of the state provided all the requisite provisions of Solid Waste Management Rules 2016 have been considered and incorporated in DPRs. To ensure this all Urban Local Bodies have been instructed to consider Solid Waste Management Rules 2016 before planning and implementation of any Solid Waste Management projects in their cities and also lay emphasis on improving current practices of Solid Waste Management in line with Solid Waste Management Rules 2016. The Minutes of the High Power Committee under Chairmanship of Hon. Chief Secretary held on 16.01.2017 is enclosed and marked as

6. I say and submit that in order to promote and encourage Urban Local Bodies, the State has developed a brand (HARIT Maha City Compost) for marketing compost generated from organic waste in Urban Local Bodies. The brand is developed to encourage Urban Local Bodies for production of quality compost and support them in marketing the same. This will in turn ensure scientific treatment of organic waste generated in Urban Local Bodies.
7. I say and submit that State of Maharashtra has prepared action plan in order to have effective Solid Waste Management systems in all ULBs as per the SWM Rules 2016. The action plan is enclosed herewith and marked as Annexure-IV. State has planned for 100% segregation of waste at source, recycling and recovery of material, 100% segregated collection and transportation of waste, 100% scientific treatment of waste and landfilling of inert etc. Action plan is prepared as per the provisions of the SWM Rules 2016 and directions provided by Hon. Tribunal.
8. I further say and submit that the State is committed towards scientific disposal of Municipal Solid Waste Management as per the doctrine of sustainable development in its true spirit as directed by the Hon. Tribunal in its order dated 12<sup>th</sup> January 2017 and assures this Hon. Tribunal of diligently following its directives.

**Introduction:**

Government has given approval for the implementation of Swachh Maharashtra Mission (Urban) under the aegis of Government of India's Swachh Bharat Mission (Urban) in the Cabinet Meeting held on 19<sup>th</sup> March 2015. In this regard the detail guidelines are being issued separately. Formation of independent State Mission Directorate and Project Management Unit (PMU) for Swachh Maharashtra Mission (Urban) was under consideration on government level.

Under this Mission Directorate implementation and monitoring of Individual Households Latrines (IHHL) construction and Solid Waste Management will be carried out.

- (1) State Mission Director will be head of the State Mission Directorate.

Annual expenditure for above mentioned post Rs. 10-15 Lakhs should be incurred from recurring expenditure of state.

**CIRCULAR OF GOVERNMENT**

Development Plans under the provisions of the Maharashtra Regional and Town Planning Act, 1966 are being prepared by the Local Authorities taking into consideration the Planning Standards prescribed in the Government circular, Urban Development and Public Health Department No. TPS 3664-N dated 23<sup>rd</sup> March 1965. A large number of Development Plans has been prepared and the experience gained by their implementation during the last few years indicates that these Planning Standards need to be revised. Government has, therefore, considered the question of revision of Planning Standards to make the Development Plans more pragmatic and realistic, and is pleased to direct that the Planning Standards shown in Annexure "C" to the Government Circular Urban Development and Public Health Department No. TPS 3664-N dated 23<sup>rd</sup> March, 1965, should be revised and should be as shown in Appendix "A" to this Circular. These revised Planning Standards should hereafter be generally adopted by the local authorities, as far as possible, while framing proposals for Development Plans under the Maharashtra Regional and Town Planning Act, 1966 and while scrutinizing such plans already prepared. Similarly, these standards should be taken into consideration while implementing proposals of sanction development plans.

APPENDIX -A

PREPARATION OF DEVELOPMENT PLANS

PLANNING STANDARDS

- 1) Open Spaces: In every Development Plan provision shall be made for public parks, playgrounds and miscellaneous open spaces in addition to playgrounds attached to schools is also regional or national parks, nature reserves, places of scenic beauty, lakes and other water bodies. The standards for providing such open spaces should be as under:
  - i. Reservation of land for the purposes of playgrounds and gardens should be made at the rate of 0.4 and 0.2 hectare per 1000 population respectively of the total population of the town and such reservations should be so distributed that they are located as far as possible within a distance of 0.80 K.M to 1.20 K.M from the residential population in a neighbourhood unit.
  - ii. Within a Gaothan, provision of open space should be made at the rate of 0.1 Ha. Per 1000 population of the projected population for the gaothan area, in the form of air lungs and totlets. This should be in addition to thereservations made under (i) above.
  - iii. .... Positive use of open spaces reserved in Residential. layouts, buildings for recreational purposes may be permitted to the extent of not more than 1/10<sup>th</sup> of total area of such reservation. K.G. Schools may also be permitted in such open spaces.

These reservations should be made in addition to the open spaces available within layouts of private lands.

- 2) Education: The school going population should be calculated at 15% of total population for primary schools and 7.5% of total population for secondary schools.
- i. Primary Schools: one site should be provided for an average size school of 400 to 500 pupils.  
Reservation of a plot for a primary school building should be on the basis of 5.sq.m per student, provided that in smaller towns where only ground floor structures are expected to be built for schools, the reservation may be at the rate of 10 Sq. M per student. Preferably, every primary school should have its attached playground, which should be provided at the rate of 3.Sq.M per student.
  - ii. Secondary Schools: One site should be provided for an average size school of 750 to 1000 pupils.  
Reservation of a plot for a secondary school building should be made on the basis of 4 Sq.M per student. Every Secondary School should have the independent playground either attached within easy walking distance not more than 0.8 Km away. Such playground reservation should be made at the rate of 11 Sq. M per student.
- 3) Health & Medical Facilities : Reservation of a plot for dispensary and maternity home should be made at the rate of 0.25 ha. Per 10,000 population.
- 4) Vegetable Market: Reservation of plot for vegetable market should be made at the rate of 0.2 ha. Per 10,000 population.
- 5) Library: Neighbourhood library sites should be provided at the rate of 0.05 ha. Per 10,000 population.
- 6) Town Hall: Site for Town Hall should be reserved as far as possible not smaller than 0.5 ha. This should be combined with a central library.
- 7) Circulation Pattern: The existing standards should continue to apply. However, road proposals to be included in the Development plan should cover

only the primary distributors and local distributors. As far as possible, widening of roads in existing developed area should be proposed by way of regular line of street under the Maharashtra Municipalities Act 1965. Where the existing roads are required to be widened immediately to a width of 15 M and above, such proposals should be supported by traffic volume survey and these proposals should be shown by firm lines.

- 8) Parking: Provision for parking of private and public vehicles should be made specially in the vicinity of railway stations, S. T. Stands, Cinema Theatres, Markets, concentrated shopping centres and other traffic generators, at the rate of 25 sq. m per P.C.U depending upon size and habits of communities.
- 9) Adequate sites for the following proposals should be provided for depending upon the needs of the towns
  1. Burial and Cremation Grounds
  2. Compost pits
  3. Slaughter Houses
  4. Fire Brigade and allied services.
  5. Multi purpose halls, community centres, theatres and cinema
  6. Cultural Centres
  7. Swimming pools and gymnasium

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
